REACHING INTO THE FUTURE



For years, Marine Reach has focused on discipling the nation of Vanuatu. This goal has been a multipronged approach, including at different times the use of marine vessels to conduct mobile medical, dental, and optical clinics to build relationships and share the love of Jesus with the Ni-Van people. It has also included the establishment of the Family Care Centre outside of Port Vila, as well as sending dozens of Discipleship Training School or School of Primary Healthcare outreach teams to go out to the villages and homes to bring practical service and the hope of the gospel.

Lianna Hood, one of the February DTS staff, recently led a team of eight outreach students along with Jack Sun to Vanuatu for the student's outreach experience. Lianna completed her DTS at Marine Reach in 2014, returned to her native Canada to train as a nurse, and has now come back to Marine Reach to serve as staff for the Medical Compassion DTS stream.

Lianna shares about her team's time in Vanuatu: "We spent 6 weeks in Vanuatu for outreach. Since the focus of our practical service was in the area of medicine, we were able to collaborate with the Family Care Centre and the excellent work that is already happening there. Our clinic days looked like doing triage for the incoming patients and doing connection-based tasks such as vital signs or basic wound care. We also were able to spend a week in the village of Rango Rango, which is located towards the centre of the island of Efate within the mountains. We enjoyed living with the Ni-Van people during that week and participating in 'island life'."

One of the highlights for the team was to experience the relationship-based culture that the Ni-Vans embrace and which the Holy Spirit moved a lot in. Lianna reflects, "Although there are always adjustments to living cross culturally, the team did a great job of seeking to express the love of Jesus through their practical service to the Ni-Van communities we were able to spend time with."

In the 35 months that I've been writing the newsletter, there have been many things that have happened at Marine Reach - many staff have come and gone, many students have participated in our programs, and there have been many opportunities to go out into our community, the nation of New Zealand, and the world beyond. It has always been pretty busy! In fact, at times, it has been rather chaotic. I cannot imagine how many hours have been spent cooking meals for people in the ministry, setting up and tearing down bunk beds, or folding laundry over these years.

So, for the first time in my history at Marine Reach (dating back to 2017), the ministry decided to take a month off. We have endeavoured to give all our staff a Sabbath rest. Some basics are being done (like paying the bills!), but in general, the month of August has been one with the specific purpose of providing an opportunity to rest.

Some staff have travelled to visit family, raise support, or do their own 4-week outreach. Many are taking this opportunity to address underlying health concerns - making nourishing food, engaging in intentional exercise, or meeting with

counsellors to discuss longstanding challenges in their patterns of relating to the world.

My family is enjoying reading lots of books, eating picnics in the winter sunshine on our deck, and playing card games. We watch the sunrise and sunset, have friends come into our home for meals and conversations, and take the kids on long walks. Overall, we have been enjoying the break and practising some rhythms to bring intentional connection into our home - with the Lord, with each other, and with others around us.

The Training Centre will begin to kick back into gear in September, and I look forward to sharing about what is happening in the rest of 2023. But for now, I trust that whatever busyness is around you, you'll be able to take a moment to breathe deeply, remember that God is with you, and experience HIS rest.

Sadly, despite the new suction pump, our two dental clinics are currently not in operation due to a shortage of dentists.

They, along with baby Leilani, provided joy and practical support, with Tim not only cooking but also running a Bible study program for the staff.


