One of the best ways to build relationships with a community and learn about a culture is through observing and connecting with the children of the culture. Jesus clearly modelled a high value for children, commanding his disciples to "Let the little children come to me" (Matthew 19:14), and as his 21st Century disciples, we want to continue to open the doors for children to encounter and meet Jesus.

The Family Care Centre has taken this initiative seriously as they run "Kids Club" each week while a "Mama's Class" providing education for pregnant women occurs simultaneously at the ministry. The Kids Club is also an opportunity to disciple the youngest members of their local NiVan community in learning about and following Jesus.

Jiska Thijsen, a staff member at the Family Care Centre, runs the weekly program for kids.

She shares her heart behind her time with the kids each week: "It's such a blessing and honour to spend time with these kids every week and teach them from God's word. They bring a lot of joy to all the base staff. After listening to a bible story, they love to play games or do arts and crafts. You better come with a lot of energy because no matter the weather, around 50 kids show up every Monday ready to be entertained."

We are so thankful for the effort, energy, and enthusiasm Jiska and the FCC puts in to reaching out to and building relationships with these young children. Please pray that the investment into their lives will bear rich fruit in the lives of these kids now and into the future.

And as a family, with their sweet little girl, they reflect an exuberance for life, intentionality in relationships, and steadfast acceptance of each person at Pacific Reach as an image bearer of God. Tim and Elzeline's delight in their daughter, who brings much laughter to the base and provides a real life reminder to approach the world with the wonder of a child, is a frequent reflection of God's parental heart toward each of us.
