DBS Wraps Up

In July, the 2024 Disciple Bible School wrapped up their three months of reading the Bible from cover to cover together, along with daily lectures covering topics and themes within the Bible.

The base celebrated with a graduation ceremony for the students. The graduation evening was one of rejoicing in God's character as evidenced in the story of Scripture, and cheering on the students who undertook the intense work of the DBS. After a ceremony where each student was presented with a certificate of completion and highlights of the school were shared, the base enjoyed a delicious dinner together one last time with the students before they departed for their homes.

Each school and group of students is a blessing in their own way, and this DBS was certainly a sweet group to share the base with. One of the distinguishing things of this DBS was a redemption of names and stepping into a God given identity. It was a great school and all of the students grew lots in their identity in Christ.

The DBS is a time of allowing the Lord to come alive through the pages of scripture, and for the students to learn to read the Bible in the context of the big picture of scripture exposing aspects of God's nature and character. Students walk away from DBS feeling more confident to delve into the Bible for themselves, along with developing a personal understanding and connection with their place in the scope of history and the Biblical story.

Tim van der Kooij, who led the DBS, shares his reflections on this school: "One of the things I hoped the students would receive is a desperation for Jesus as our All. Like Peter says in John 6:68 'Lord, to whom would we go? You have the words of eternal life.' Going through the whole Bible in community is so powerful, and the Spirit works through it to bring transformation towards maturity in Christ. This was evident in this school. It was an honour to walk with the students as we all grew in our imitation of Christ."

Last year the base took the month of August to rest, rejuvenate, and reconnect with family, friends, supporters, and (most importantly) the Lord. For many of us, it was a month to slow down, breathe deeply, and invest in the relationships near and dear to our hearts. That time reenergized my family's weekly Sabbath practice.

In my own life, as a mother of four small children, I have found my family's weekly Sabbath practice to be a life giving exercise. While this year's month of rest looked a lot different than our weekly Sabbaths, my husband and I approached this time with the same guiding principles.

Whether it is a weekly day off or a month of slower rhythms, we like to enter our Sabbath rests in the following ways:

1 - Identify the Purpose: For our weekly Sabbaths, our purpose is to connect as a family and create space in our week to enter rejuvenating rest.
Our work weeks are busy with my husband's role at Pacific Reach, homeschooling, and running a household. On our weekly Saturday Sabbath, we cut out much of that and prioritise family connection.

- 2 Create a Plan: We've decided to make our Saturday Sabbaths usually follow a similar structure each week so we all know what the routine is. This way we don't have to do extra mental work making decisions on Sabbath.
- 3 Intentionally Prepare: I have found that real rest does not happen by accident with kids in the house! So for our weekly Sabbaths, I prepare by cleaning the house the day before and mapping out a plan for our Sabbath meals. It means a bit of extra work up front, but having a full 24 hours of not rushing or running errands is well worth it. We also try to power down our phones and computers for the duration of Sabbath to minimise our distractions.

Wherever you are in your Sabbath practice, I pray that you will regularly be able to enter into real rest and reap rich relationship with the Lord and those around you.

Dr. Hadleigh Lends a Helping Hand



Over many years, Pacific Reach has operated ships across the Pacific with key individuals playing significant roles in helping to pioneer the ministry. Hadleigh Reid joined Pacific Reach as a student on one of our Discipleship Training Schools in 2013 and went on to staff our schools for the following two years.

Being a registered dentist, he first visited Vanuatu in 2013 providing free dental care to the local population. Hadleigh continued to serve on several occasions on our last ship, the M/V Pacific Hope, before it was redeployed to the Caribbean.

In 2019 Hadleigh taught dental care at Port Vila's local hospital. His service there invested in the local health care community, which in turn created a lasting impact on the dental community in the nation. His contribution of his time and resources to our dental program in Vanuatu has been a part of what has made the program possible.
